Dragana Bodruzic:

"Corporate Social Responsibility in the Global South: A Comparison of Brazil and India"

Much of the literature on CSR considers the Global North, and we are still struggling to understand how the concept has been adopted elsewhere around the globe. A comparison of Brazil and India shows how local ideas and institutions have influenced the development of CSR in these contexts, pointing to the need to pay greater attention to historical trajectories in shaping the relationship between business, society, and the state.

Dragana Bodruzic is a PhD candidate in political science at the University of Toronto. She has a BBA from Simon Fraser University and an MPhil in Development Studies from University of Oxford. Her doctoral research considers the involvement of corporate actors in welfare provision in the Global South through a comparative study of Brazil and India.
